Resolution 33/23 - Randwick City Council consider the undergrounding of the power lines in the area bounded by the ocean, Dolphin, Mount and Dudley Street in future Operational plans and Budgets.

Council response:

Undergrounding of powerlines requires significant funding including restoration of the footpath paving and new light poles. The proposal to progressively underground powerlines, either along the coastline or across the city has been costed in the past and it was not pursued due to an unfavourable project feasibility. It was determined that undergrounding of power only been considered as part of town centre upgrades or localised public domain upgrades supporting commercial centres. The undergrounding of powerlines will be included when town centre upgrades are planned.

In relation to the conflict of powerlines and trees, council manages the coexistence of trees and powerlines across the city. Costs for tree maintenance do not offset the cost to underground powerlines.
