### **Resolution:**

Resolution 44/23: RCC investigate the provision of waste bins which can be securely closed until collection thus preventing overflow of food waste which is contributing to the current rat problem.

### **Council response:**

As previously communicated to the precinct in a correspondence sent back in September, Council has taken the appropriate actions to address the issue with rats at Coogee. Council Public Place officers and Waste services team are monitoring the area to address any issue as it arises.

Regarding the request for securely closed bins to prevent the overflow of waste, I would like to advise that all public bins at Coogee (Beachfront and business centre) are serviced throughout the day until 10 pm during the summer season and 6:30 pm in the winter season.

Council provides additional litter bins and services throughout the beachside areas during busy periods.

### **Resolution:**

Resolution 45/23: RCC review the planting of succulents and statice plants in public areas as these are not plants native to the area.

### **Council response:**

Council has different planting schemes based on the area and purpose of the planting. Bush regeneration and Bushcare sites use indigenous native plants, park plantings are often native, whilst streetscape gardens use a mixture of native and exotic plants for the purpose of producing colourful and creative displays.

The succulents that have been used recreate an underwater theme, they are hardy, do not spread (regenerate outside the planting area), colourful and handle the salt laden winds at Coogee. The team has worked hard to investigate appropriate plants for roundabouts and roadside locations for the enjoyment of the community and they receive much positive feedback regarding their efforts.
