Resolution 10072023(1) - Cnr Lawson and ANZAC Parade outside Nude Pizza. Council to examine placing Planer box to protect residents dining outside at restaurant, also green the corner.

Council response:

This matter was considered by council in response to resolution 18102022 (11). Council responded as follows:

This matter has been investigated to determine if there is a pedestrian safety concern at this location. The assessment considered vehicle turning paths, road geometry, travel lane configurations and footpath usage. We reviewed the crash data for this intersection. Overall, the footpath at this location does not have a higher risk than at other similar intersections along Anzac Parade.

As a result of the assessment, it determined that bollards are not required.

In relation to planter boxes for beautification, this has been added to the list of future upgrades of the Malabar town centre.

In the November Traffic Committee meeting, the Council's proposal was presented and subsequently endorsed. The proposal aims to extend the current no-stopping restriction on the north side of Daunt Avenue, specifically outside no. 64. This extension would span an additional 7.4 metres in a westerly direction, reaching the eastern edge of the driveway to no. 62.
